



IPSE Campus Life Peer Mentor Position Description

Position Title: IPSE Campus Life Peer Mentor
Department: Integrated Post-Secondary Education Society of Alberta
Hours: 2 – 4 hours per month

This is a competitive undergraduate student volunteer opportunity open to all University of Calgary students.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

The Integrated Post-Secondary Education (IPSE) program on campus is looking for volunteers to be peer mentors for IPSE students. The IPSE program works with adults with developmental disabilities and supports them through the post-secondary education experience at University of Calgary.

As a peer mentor, you would be paired one-to-one with an IPSE student mentee based on shared interests. Your role as a peer mentor would be to support your mentee by engaging in campus life. Peer mentors attend campus events with their mentee, this would include events like SU club events and DINOS games, as well as more casual activities like wing nights at The Den and using Active Living facilities. The events would be chosen collaboratively between you as the peer mentor and your mentee.

TASKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Meet with your mentee on a bi-weekly or monthly basis to attend events/activities on campus
- Actively plan activities for you and the mentee to attend together, collaborating with the mentee to identify shared interests and create meaningful opportunities for connection and community involvement.
- Maintain active communication with the mentee, their Facilitator, and the IPSE Peer Mentor Coordinator

- Actively foster an inclusive community at the University of Calgary

COMMITMENT

The time commitment of this position is 2-4 hours per month, depending on what the IPSE student's goals are. You will also have to check in with the IPSE student's Facilitator on a monthly basis, or more if needed.

- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- Flexibility and an understanding attitude
- Knowledge of campus life at University of Calgary
- Experience with people with disabilities is an asset
- First Aid Certification is preferred
